DEP announces new grant program

The Chamber's Sustainability Committee recently hosted its first Pathways to Sustainability event featuring a panel of industry leaders and educational tables providing interaction with businesses focused on sustainability efforts. The keynote address was presented by Louie Krak, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), who unveiled a new statewide grant program.

RISE PA is a \$396 million statewide industrial de-carbonization grant program funded through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Climate Pollution Reduction Grants.

The purpose of the program is to offer grants for small-, medium-, and large-scale de-carbonization projects at industrial facilities to substantially reduce both greenhouse gas emissions and co-pollutant emissions.

"The program will help industrial companies reduce operating costs and boost their competitiveness all while creating a lot of good paying jobs and ensuring that benefits from these projects flow to impacting communities", Krak said. "It's a tremendous investment in Pennsylvania industry".

A large part of the program is energy efficiency, which is the largest segment



of Pennsylvania's clean energy economy and employs the greatest number of workers that have seen consistent job growth each year.

Through RISE PA, Pennsylvania companies can prepare for anticipated global market shifts by making proactive investments in industrial de-carbonization.

The DEP is now accepting applications for the medium- and large-scale award tracks. Applications are available online at the DEP RISE PA website. Applicants can review the grant program and eligibility criteria.

"I see RISE PA as a very poetic opportunity for Pennsylvania. We were one of the birthplaces of the industrial revolution, and now we have an opportunity to lead the country in the industrial de-carbonization movement," Krak said.
